

HEALTH, SAFETY AND ENVIRONMENT POLICY

University Access Centre's Health, Safety and Environment ("HSE") Policy will be to:

- Have a systematic approach to HSE management designed to ensure compliance with the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia's applicable law and to achieve continuous performance improvement
- Set targets for improvement
- Measure, appraise and report on performance
- Require contractors to manage HSE in line with this policy
- Require affiliates and joint ventures under its operational control to apply this policy and use its influence to promote this policy in its or their other ventures
- Include HSE performance in the appraisal of all staff
- Inform staff of their duty to intervene if they believe an activity is unsafe or fails to meet our environmental standards
